• Dr. Vikram Tyagi and Prof. Vaishali Dhingra; REVERSE SUPPLY CHAINS IN THE NEW ERA OF MARKETING: Special reference to supply chain disruptions during covid-19

This is a review of papers related to supply chain and reverse logistics based on various volatile environmental factors and it has been conceptualised after doing a thorough review of available published literature in this area by the authors.
